1987 Public Programs

A secondary, albeit minor event was the premier showing of "Cecil B." Dibbell's super-8 home movie of "The Second Greatest Story Ever Told", better known as: The Building of Fremont Peak Observatory. This 15 minute silent spectacular chronicled some of the milestones of the construction effort. Due to popular demand, the movie will be re-shown at the August 29th Annual Picnic and Star-B-Q.

As you may or may not know, the summer public programs are conducted by Association Members who have been certified on the 30-inch reflector. If you are a certified member, you should have received a "Public Program Signup Sheet" in the mail. FPOA Elections

Each year three members of the FPOA Board of Directors are elected by and from qualified Association members. A Board Member serves a three year term of office; therefore every year one-third of the Board is replaced. The election will take place at our annual general membership meeting on August 29th at the "Peak".

Terms of office begin January 1st of the year following the election, and end on December 31st of the third year following the election. Candidates elected this August will begin their term on January 1st, 1988, and serve until December 31st, 1990.

Any general, contributing, sustaining, or life member who will have been an Association member for one year by August 29, 1987 is qualified to vote, and to run for, a position on the FPOA Board. The Board positions held by Denni Medlock, Frank Dibbell, and John Stewart are up for election this year. Denni and Frank have agreed to stand for John, currently the FPOA re-election. Treasurer, has declined to run for re-election. In his capacity as the FPOA's first treasurer and a founding member of the association, John saw to it that all our tax-exempt paperwork was in order, in addition to handling all the Association's financial dealings. The Board wishes to thank John for the outstanding job he has done the past three years.

In addition to Frank and Denni, Association members Kevin Medlock, Donn Mukensnable, and Mike Ryan have been nominated for positions on the FPOA Board. Kevin, builder of the 30-inch and one of the founding members of the Association, has served on the Board previously. Donn was assistant foreman during observatory construction, and spent many weekends, sometimes solo, working on the building. Mike is a long-time amateur astronomer active in local Astronomical societies, and has been an Association member since early 1985.

Interested in participating in a Meteor Shower Watch? Then get involved with the 13th Annual Upsilon Pegasid Meteor Shower Watch! The maximum occurs near full moon (around August 8th), so optimum viewing will probably be the weekends of July 24th and August 1st. The current focus of research is on photographic patrol of the shower radiant.

The ideal camera is a 35mm with a fast 50mm lens, using either Kodak 2475 or T-Max 400 film, and exposures of 5 minutes or less. The camera should be pointed directly at the radiant. For further information on this event, contact:
